Absence Policy: If a student will be absent or late, a parent or guardian must notify the school by 8am on the date of each absence. If you require homework for your student, please inform us how you would like this handled in your message. To report an absence, call 847-296-1163 (the Absentee hotline). This answering machine is available 24 hours/7 days a week.

Arrival & Dismissal Procedure: Our day begins at 7:45 a.m., the bell rings and students report to their classrooms. Students who are not in the classroom by the 7:55 bell are considered tardy. Our day ends at 2:40 p.m. This bell rings and we end the day with announcements; 2:45pm dismissal of extended care students, and car riders. Car riders are dismissed to the back (north) parking lot.

For the safety of your children, follow the driving procedures found on our website. It is important that you follow traffic patterns at drop off and pick up. Please note: Pre-K 3 and 4-year old morning class hours are 7:55am – 11:00am.

Catholic Schools Week: Held in late January, Catholic Schools Week is an annual diocese-wide celebration of the benefits of Catholic Education. We celebrate with a variety of activities including a Community Open house, teacher appreciation luncheon and spirit wear days. Our annual Scholastic Book Fair and Fun Fair occur during Catholic Schools Week.

Dress Down Days: These are out-of-uniform days. Students will be instructed regarding the theme of the special day, for example, wearing red white and blue in honor of Veterans Day. On Spirit Wear dress down days, students are allowed to wear St. Emily School spirit wear. Spirit wear clothing may be special-ordered each school year. Students are not required to purchase Spirit wear. Students may wear their P.E. clothes on spirit wear dress down days.

Family School Association (FSA): The St. Emily Family School Association is designed to encourage parent involvement, support our school and build our sense of school community. Parent volunteers run the Hot Lunch program, Santa's Workshop, Book Fair, Fun Fair, and so much more. Every parent that has a child attending St. Emily School is already a member!

Manna/Scrip Gift Cards: This program provides parents with the opportunity to purchase pre-paid merchant cards at face value that can be used "same as cash". Gift card vendors include food & drug stores, gas stations, home & electronics stores, school & office supplies, retail stores, book stores, entertainment, hotels and restaurants. St. Emily School receives a rebate ranging from 2 to 25% of the value of the card.

May Crowning: May Crowning is a traditional event held in May to honor the Blessed Mother. At the May Crowning, the 2nd graders, in their Communion attire, line the main aisle as the 8th graders process in. Together, they sing Marian hymns, and one 8th grade student crowns the Blessed Mother with a wreath of flowers.

Monday Hot Lunch: Kindergarten through 8th grade students have the opportunity to order special hot lunches on Mondays. Hot lunch Mondays are pre-ordered and pre-paid monthly. Vendors have included Panda Express, Dominos, Mr. Beef and Pizza, Avanti, and Subway. Parents create an online account with Boonli.

Room Parent: Each class has one room parent who helps plan parties for Halloween, Christmas, and the school picnic. However, two parents may share the position. Room parents organize gift collections for teacher appreciation and student appreciation days, and help the teachers as requested.

School Uniforms: School uniform polo shirts, jumpers/skirts and uniform sweatshirts must be purchased at Dennis Uniform. Navy blue pants/shorts may be purchased at any major retailer. The office can supply you with a flyer for Dennis uniform with more information.

P.E. uniforms: sweatshirt, sweatpants, t-shirt and shorts, will be sold in the school office while supplies last. Several sizes are only available at Dennis Uniform. All Pre-K students wear P.E. uniforms daily.

Each June, we hold a Used Uniform sale. Please see our website for information or contact the school office for exact dates and times.

St. Emily School Board: The school board is a leadership group within the ministry of Catholic schooling. Local school boards are advisory to the pastor and the principal. The meetings are held bi-monthly and are open to the public. The dates and times are announced in the school's monthly calendar and on the school website.

Talent Show: All students may try out for the annual Talent Show, held in the spring.

Teacher Contacts: Formal parent/teacher conferences are held in November and April. Teachers are available to discuss students' progress with parents any time during the year. Teachers may also be reached by e-mail. Staff e-mail addresses are found in our School Directory. Every family receives a directory in late September.

Track-a-thon: This annual fundraiser occurs in the spring. Students obtain pledges from friends and family for every lap run on our outside track. Students run throughout the day, with their grade level. Parent volunteers serve as lap counters.

Virtus Training: In order to volunteer for any school activity, parents must complete an online background check and attend a Virtus Training session. Copies of the Virtus certificate are submitted to the school office, where you will also complete a Code of Conduct and CANTS form.

Wednesday's News: School information is updated online every Wednesday, including the Principal's newsletter, monthly school calendars, important fundraising events, outside information from YMCA, athletic and arts camps, ***Special e-mail blasts may be sent during the week with important reminders or urgent information.***

We ask that all Pre-K through 8th Grade families check the Wednesday News link on our website. Also, Pre-K teachers send out their own monthly calendars and newsletters.
